We need to understand with <u>our MINDS</u> as well as our hearts (1 Cor. 14:20) This helps us to <u>GROW</u> spiritually (Heb. 5:11-6:1), and know what the <u>WHOLE COUNSEL</u> of God is (Acts 20:27), not just haphazard opinions "I think" or "I guess,".

Theology helps us to CHECK OUT what is right teaching and what is wrong teaching about God. Right teaching builds strong Christians and strong CHURCHES. (2 Tim.4:1-5; Titus 1:9-11)

Theology helps us to <u>LIVE PROPERLY</u> (ethics). An understanding of the Christian message should lead us to a change in the way we live (James 3:13, 1 Timothy 1:10, 6:3, Titus 1:1)

Theology helps us **EXPLORE** our **FAITH** more clearly to other people (1 Peter 3:15).

No person or church can explain the Christian faith perfectly. There is always some "mystery" about God. God is infinite; we are FINITE God is holy; we are SINFUL. We should not pretend to have all the answers.

What does the Bible say in Romans 1:18-20, 32; 2:14-15 about knowledge?

GOD GIVES US KNOWLEDGE OF HIMSELF

Read Psalm 19:1-6

The witness GOES ON FOREVER (v.2) "day and night"

The witness is WORDLESS (v. 3) "able to be understood by everyone"

The witness is **UNIVERSAL** (v. 4) "it extends throughout all the earth"

Acts 14:17 Paul tells the people at Lystra that God "<u>HE HAS NOT LEFT HIMSELF WITHOUT TESTIMONY</u>."

This is shown by his kindness in "giving the rain from heaven and crops in their season. God provides plenty of food and fills your hearts with joy."
